GRADUATE COUNCIL MINUTES

October 24, 2014

The Graduate Council met at 2:00 p.m. in Ingram 101. Chair Nita Brooks presided.

I. Call to Order

II. Announcements

A. Dr. Nita Brooks, Chair

Dr. Brooks opened the meeting.

B. Dr. Jackie Eller, Interim Dean, College of Graduate Studies

C. Dr. Scott Handy, Interim Associate Dean, College of Graduate Studies

Dr. Handy noted that the College of Graduate Studies is working to reduce confusion for students by having a one-step admissions process as opposed to a two-step process. We are also working to shorten the turnaround time on routed applications. Ideally, we would like to have an admission decision from departments within a two-week timeframe.

Dr. Handy asked the Student Affairs and Travel Committee to look through the College of Graduate Studies existing exit survey to note which questions are helpful and relevant and provide feedback by November 7th. It was noted that there needs to be a way to contact the students once they have graduated.

The College of Graduate Studies would like to begin extracting the application data regarding how the applicant heard about MTSU. This will be a part of our initiative to refine our recruitment efforts.

Dr. Handy reported that Leisure and Sport Management has a new ABM pending approval at the undergraduate level.

III. Approval of minutes from last meeting—September 26, 2014

A motion was made to accept the minutes of the September 26, 2014. The motion was seconded and passed.

IV. Sub-Committee Reports

A. Graduate Faculty and Curriculum Review Dr. Vaughn Barry, Chair

B. Student Affairs and Travel Dr. Kathleen Darby, Chair

• In Dr. Darby's absence, Josh Howard noted that the travel funds have been exhausted for any fall conference presentations. There are plans to have \$5000 available in this account for the spring semester.

C. Policies and Procedures Dr. Bichaka Fayissa, Chair

- Dr. Fayissa distributed a handout reflecting three recommendations from the committee.
- The three recommendations included:
 - 1. Clarification of the current policy regarding Graduate Assistant Tuition Only Assistantships. Tuition Only assistantships are used in special instances and are approved for summer terms only. In graduate programs in which students are working a summer internship, students must be enrolled in at least one graduate credit hour of classes during the summer semester. The committee left it up to the discretion of the College of Graduate Studies whether or not the Tuition Only Assistantship form will be posted on the website.
 - 2. Change the current two-step graduate admission process to a one-step process. Currently, the applicant first has to be accepted by the College of Graduate Studies, and then has to be accepted by the graduate degree program of their choice. With the change, the applicant will only be admitted to a specific program.

- 3. Amendment to the Graduate Assistantship Policy regarding time limits for support. The proposed policy stipulates:
 - A. A graduate assistantship can be held for 5 years (15 semesters).
 - B. For support beyond 5 years, up to an additional 1 year (3 semesters) can be granted upon review of academic progress.
 - C. In exceptional cases, there is the option for 1 year (3 semesters) of support beyond the 5th year which can be granted by request on a semester-by-semester basis.

A motion was made to accept the three recommendations with amendments to 3A and 3C. For clarification, add the words "**up to**" after "for" in 3A. After the minor change, it now reads: A graduate assistantship can be held for up to 5 years (15 semesters). There was a typo in 3C. The year should have read 6th. Thus, 3C has been amended to read as follows: In exceptional cases, there is the option for 1 year (3 semesters) of support beyond the **6**th year which can be granted by request on a semester-by-semester basis.

The motion was seconded and passed.
