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Psychology Candidacy Program	Summer 2024	Change to admission, retention, progression, or graduation policy	The proposal is to terminate the candidacy program which was implemented in fall 2014 as part of a university-wide initiative to increase student retention and progression. The candidacy program will be replaced with another method that will allow for students to be assigned a faculty advisor earlier in their curriculum.	19

We are proposing a retention and progression policy that focuses on identifying dispositional issues and supporting students so they continue to progress if possible. The policy also includes details for supporting students to transition out of the program if progress is not made or the student displays a professionalism or ethical issue that places PK-12 students at risk.	2

University Honors Minor	Summer 2024	Change to Curriculum of existing major (including concentrations), minor, or certificate	Reducing the number of hours in the University Honors minor (UH) from 29 to 23. This reduction includes removing the "3 hours of any 3000/4000 level honors course" and changing "18 hours of any 1000/2000 level honors course" to "15 hours of any level honors course." There are also some changes to the courses allowed within the Interdisciplinary Seminar requirement (allowing research hours to count in this category) and Lecture Series requirement (allowing the use of ENGL 3635 to satisfy this requirement).	21
