Student Instructions		
One (1) copy signed by major and minor advisors (minor advisor signature not required for "built-in" minors) should be filed with your College Graduation Coordinator - Undergraduate Services (formerly Graduation Analyst) 3 semesters before you intend to graduate by sending to MTSU Box 101. An Intent to Graduate form should be filed in the Records Office during first semester of the senior year.

2. Transfer credits and substitutions must be initiated by the advisor.

US History Requirement

- The legislature approved a law that would allow students to have any 6 hour sequence in History to meet the General Education requirement
- It must be History 1010-1020, 1110-1120 or 2010-2030
- This policy has NOT been approved by TBR at this time
- Only transfer students would be allowed to use anything other than US History
- We are awaiting final approval and a campus-wide announcement.

International Students

- MTSU has a new initiative to escalate the number of international students on campus
- We strongly suggest that these students obtain a WES (World Education Service) or some other professional agency evaluate their work
- Not only will it assist in the evaluation process for their degree, but many employers are now requiring a copy
