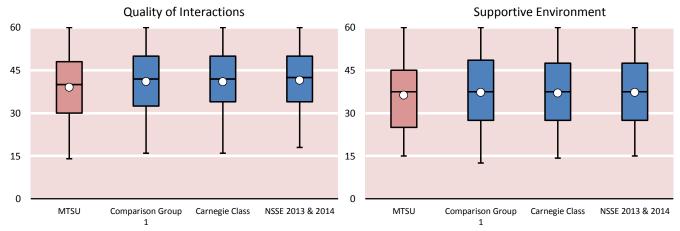
Campus Environment: First-year students
