## **OWLS Academic Service Scholarship**

OWLS, the Older, Wiser Learner Students organization awards ten Academic Service Scholarships each year. These scholarships provide \$1,500 per semester and require five hours per week of work on campus, normally in an office associated with the student's major. **Deadline:** Ten weeks prior to the beginning of the term for which the grant is requested

This grant program is aimed at providing financial assistance to women whose education has been interrupted and who want to resume studies due to changing demands within their lives. Eligibility for the grant includes sponsorship by a P.E.O chapter; citizenship and studying in the United States or Canada; has at least 24 consecutive months as a non-student during adult life; is within 24 months of completing her educational goal; and not enrolled in a doctoral degree program. The maximum award given is \$2,000 and intended for use on tuition, transportation, books, or childcare necessary to reach an educational goal. An interview process is required.
