### **Solving a Crime—Tiffany B. Saul**

Students will explore techniques used by real-life crime scene investigators (CSI) and learn the basics of science behind tools like DNA analysis, fingerprinting, and anthropology. Hands-on activities allow participants to experience how the investigative process works and analyze evidence that will help solve a “WhoDunnit?” mystery throughout the course. Saul, a forensic anthropologist, is a research assistant professor with the MTSU Forensic Institute for Research and Education (FIRE). She completed her Ph.D. at the University of Tennessee, where she conducted her research at the world-famous Anthropology Research Facility, known as “The Body Farm.”

### **Greatest Speeches—Perry C. Cotham**

There have been stirring books, essays, and editorials in American history, but the spoken word has been far more influential in shaping the nation’s cultural, religious, and political life. We will establish standards for rhetorical greatness, look at various forums where these addresses were presented, and survey the most famous speeches and most influential speakers in U.S. history. Selections range from colonial days to current times. Cotham, an MTSU Communication Studies lecturer, earned an M.A. and Ph.D. in Speech Communication from Wayne State University. His dissertation focused on the rhetoric of the New Deal and World War II era, and his books include *From Pilgrim Pulpit to the Electronic Era* and *In Search of Rhetorical Excellence*.

### **Science and God—Mark “Nate” Callender**

According to a recent Gallup poll, 89 percent of Americans believe in the existence of God. This is in a time when the fruits of scientific discovery are more evident than ever before. Is this a paradox? Can a believer in God actually embrace the results of science? Can a scientist reasonably accept that God exists? Must we choose one or the other: God or science? Callender, an MTSU Aerospace associate professor, holds an M.S. in Aviation Systems and a Ph.D. in Engineering Science from the University of Tennessee Space Institute. He wants his students to discover the truth of Proverbs 3:13.
