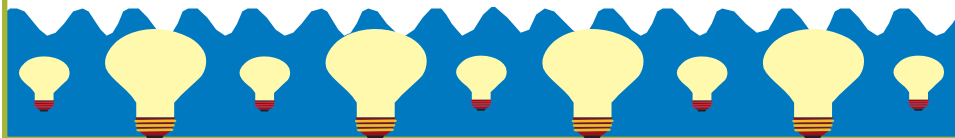
Barbara Young, Professor,
