GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: Understanding Your 120 Hours

Without these requirements, you cannot graduate!

- You must complete a minimum of 120 hours for a B.S. degree.
- You must earn a grade of C or better (C- does not count) in each course taken in the College of Mass Communication to graduate.
- You must earn a minimum of 80 hours outside the College of Mass Communication; of those 80 hours, *at least* 65 hours must be liberal arts and sciences: see liberal arts and sciences minors list on back of this form for acceptable areas of study.
