- Degrees require a minimum of 120 semester hours (12 of the last 18 at MTSU) with at least a 2.0 GPA, a minimum of 42 upper-division hours (30 at MTSU) with at least a 2.0 GPA, and a minimum of 60 senior college hours.
- Remedial/developmental courses do not count toward the 120-hour requirement or cumulative degree GPA.
- Courses used to fulfill high school deficiencies can only be counted as general elective credit.
- Any course substitutions must be approved on an MTSU Course Substitution form with appropriate advisor, department chair, and college dean signatures.
