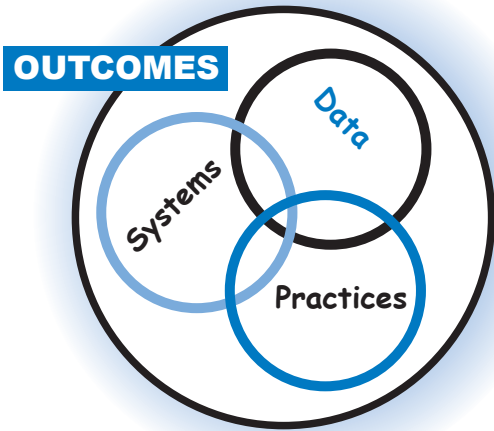

Start your own PBSI team!

1. Establish a PBS team.
2. Prioritize and describe the issues.
3. Review existing information/data.
4. Set measurable outcomes related directly to issue and context.
5. Use evidence-based practice to achieve specified outcomes.
6. Provide supports for implementation.
7. Monitor implementation and progress toward outcome.
8. Modify as needed based on ongoing analysis of data collected.

Services We Offer

1. Ongoing, one-on-one support for students with severe behavioral challenges.
2. Consultation for teachers working with students who exhibit challenging behaviors.
3. Small- and large-group workshops and seminars on effective behavior management strategies.
4. Focused classroom observations.
5. Attendance at behavior-related IEP meetings by invitation (supportive, neutral role).
6. Micro- and macro-level implementation of PBS.
7. Guidance and support on writing FBAs and BIPs.
8. Parent training workshops on managing student behavior at home.
9. Other behavioral support services based on your school's needs.

Positive Behavior Support and Inclusion

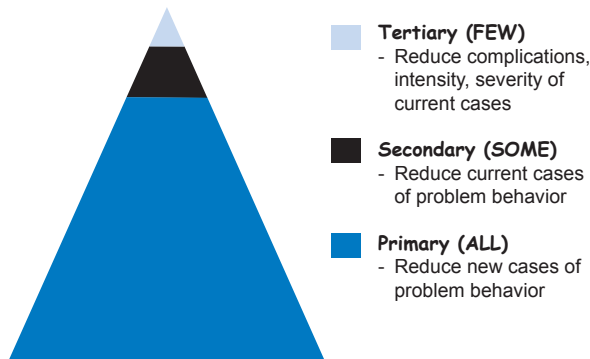
What is Positive Behavior Support (PBS)?

- PBS encourages social competence and academic achievement through strategies, practices, and interventions that have empirical support and have been proven to be effective.
- PBS emphasizes operationally defined and valued outcomes for all students.
- PBS is data driven.
- PBS uses a positive approach to addressing negative behaviors.
- PBS is based on behavioral and biomedical sciences and can be applied to address problem behavior in schools.
- PBS emphasizes research-validated practices, interventions, and strategies.
- PBS gives priority to systems change considerations that support the effective and efficient selection and implementation of practices by school personnel.

Featured Speaker: Dr. Tim Lewis

Dr. Tim Lewis has been involved in special education for 25 years. Dr. Lewis has taught students with emotional and behavioral disorders in high school, elementary school, and self-contained psychiatric settings. At present, he is a professor of special education at the University of Missouri. He is coeditor of the journal *Behavioral Disorders*, associate editor of the *Journal of Positive Behavior Interventions*, and a member of nine other editorial boards. Dr. Lewis has been involved with developing school-wide systems of behavioral support for over 20 years. He has worked directly with school teams around the world, secured several federal grants to support his research and demonstration efforts, and has frequently contributed to the professional literature examining various aspects of Positive Behavior Support. Dr. Lewis directs the University of Missouri Center for School-wide Positive Behavior Support, and codirects the national OSEP Center for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports and the IES Center for Adolescent Research in Schools. He has directed research, model/demonstration, and personnel preparation grants. His specialty areas include social skill instruction, functional assessment, and proactive school-wide discipline systems.
