



Call for SECOLAS Awards Submissions for 2012

SECOLAS awards three prizes each year: the Sturgis Leavitt Award, the A.B. Thomas Award, and the Edward H. Moseley Award. The presentation of the awards is made at the annual meeting, and the names of the winners and their works are printed in *The Latin Americanist*. The next conference will be held in Gainesville, FL March 29-31, 2012 by the Center for Latin American Studies at the University of Florida. The theme for this conference is “The Struggle for Democracy in Latin America”

A. The Sturgis Leavitt Award. (DEADLINE JAN. 15, 2012)

The Sturgis Leavitt Award is given annually for the best article or book chapter on a Latin American or Iberian subject published by a SECOLAS member in the previous calendar year. The article may be written in any language. Preference will be given to articles that have an appeal beyond a single discipline. Selection of the winning article or book chapter is made by a committee of three members selected by the Executive Committee. Members serve for three years on a rotating basis.

B. The Alfred B. Thomas Award. (DEADLINE JAN. 15, 2012)

The Alfred B. Thomas Award is awarded annually for the best book on a Latin American subject published by a SECOLAS member in the previous year. Co-authored works may be considered, but not anthologies or edited works. Books may be in any language. Authors must have been members of SECOLAS for the two calendar years preceding the year in which the prize will be awarded. Selection of the winning book is made by a committee of three members, at least one of whom is not a historian, selected by the Executive Committee. Members serve for three years on a rotating basis.
