A Bill amend the qualifications for the eligibility for members of the Executive Branch

Whereas: An understanding of the inner workings of a Student Government Association is integral

to serving as an Executive Branch Officer.

Whereas: Serving as an Executive Branch officer is a commitment understood best by members of

a Student Government Association.

Whereas: It is possible for this experience to be gained at a college other than MTSU.

Whereas: Currently in the Constitution there is no requirement in relation to service with an SGA.

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE 73nd CONGRESS OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF MIDDLE TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY THAT:

Section 1: Article IV Section 1 Subsection C of the SGA Constitution shall be amended by adding the following:

"5. Have served at least one semester as a member in good standing with a Student Government Association at any accredited university or community college at the time of candidacy."

Section 2: The student referendum shall read, "Do you support the efforts of the Student Government Association to amend the SGA Constitution by altering the eligibility to run for an Executive Office by requiring the candidates to have served as a member of a Student Government Association previously? Yes or No."
