Working Definitions (1 of 3)

Academic Engagement

Academic engagement is a student's active learning experiences as demonstrated through quality of effort, physical and psychological involvement, and participation in productive learning activities.

Working Definitions (2 of 3)

Critical Reflection

Critical reflection is the meta-cognitive act through which a student reflects on a learning experience and evaluates both new information and the frames of reference through which the information acquires meaning.

Working Definitions (3 of 3)

Integrative Learning

Integrative and applied learning is an understanding and a disposition that a student builds across the curriculum and co-curriculum, from making simple connections among ideas and experiences to synthesizing and transferring learning to new, complex situations within and beyond the campus.*
