"I was not able to attend the meeting, so I apologize if this was asked and answered. While I am in favor of raising standards, I am wondering if the university will be able to make exceptions for outstanding students. In the School of Music, we have had wonderful musicians who are a great asset to the program, but would not meet the new English language entrance standards. If exceptions are not allowed, I am concerned about the potential impact on our future recruitment. "

From Jackie Eller;

"Absolutely we can make exceptions for outstanding students. We hope, of course, that students would be able to achieve the standard so that their success is not impacted, but we can be flexible for outstanding students otherwise. Further, we understand that English skills are more necessary in some programs than in others as well, so that would be part of the exception consideration."

From email dated November 11, 2015, 8:36 am from Chair Annette Williams:

"The vote results for the proposal to raise the English language proficiency standards for admission to the College of Graduate Studies were 9 faculty votes to approve the proposal with no votes against. I did not receive any student member votes. The proposal is approved, and I will be in contact with Dr. Handy to sign the form."
