Additional consideration given to minority individuals, particularly Native Americans and African Americans.

James S. Gibson Sculpture Scholarship

One award; BFA Studio Art Major with sculpture concentration/focus; Full-time or Part-time student; Junior or Senior

Applicants for this award must also demonstrate promise with a proven academic record. Special consideration given to students from Tennessee and West Virginia.

Department of Art Scholarship for Art Majors

One or more awards; BFA Studio Art Major; Full-time or Part-time student; Freshman, Sophomore or Junior

Jerry's Artarama Art Supply Award

One award; Awarded in the Spring Semester; BFA Studio Art Major; Full-time or Part-time student


