Steps to Graduate Student Enrollment Growth

- Assessment study the data and know the market potential
- **People** create a team, change culture, become service focused
- **Processes** remove barriers and processes and automate when possible.
- **Technology** amazon.com as the model, not the DMV
- Marketing need to be known in the market; use of social media; new demographics = new behaviors
- **Communication** timely responses on queries with multiple communication channels including weekends

Our Pandemic Pivot for Enrollment

- Spend more, not less, on marketing
- Lead with positive and optimistic messages in ads
- Trial, error, trial, success. Failure o.k. if lessons learned.
- Standardize test score waivers to reduce barriers to entry
 - 87-89% of programs opted to waive test scores for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 Academic Year
- Sale: \$1 graduate application fee to get their attention
 - 2020 Campaign, 25 days, 1,042 \$1 applications
 - 2021 Campaign, 45 days, 673 \$1 applications


