Projects and Activities

- Tina Stewart Funds The Campus Non-Violence sub-committee met and recommended the following projects receive funding. Both recommendations were approved by a vote of the Campus Non-Violence Committee members:
 - o Social Work: \$500.00
 - o Human Development: \$1,500.00
- The International Day of Nonviolence/Party with a Purpose was held on October 2, 2024. Tommy Roberts recounted his experience during the event, explaining that he felt the event went well and was well attended. The event included campus police grilling hot dogs and hamburgers alongside chips and drinks for attendees. There were non-violence

yard signs. Gandhi cutouts and an "I'm True Blue" banner for attendees to sign. Other giveaways included buttons and T-shirts. However, the T-shirts ran out during the event.

Committee Funding

• The Committee spent \$2,500 on the Party with a Purpose Event for the International Day of Nonviolence. These funds came from the Student Affairs budget.

Future Projects

- The potential dates for next year are October 6 − 10, 2025, to avoid scheduling during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Considerations for next year to improve the event would include seating for attendees to sit and eat, along with more T-shirts. We also discussed adding a vegetarian option to the menu. This event will also be added as a Connection Point event for 25-26—housing plans to partner for the 2025 event and share their grill.
- Danielle Rochelle discussed the Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration and Candlelight Vigil plan for January 2025. It was discussed that this event will take place on Wednesday, January 22, 2025. Danny Kelley mentioned having someone talk about the history of the True Blue pledge during the event and possible tabling for the Non-Violence committee. Additionally, the committee discussed sponsoring shuttles to community MLK events from campus. Danielle Rochelle will work on getting details for Murfreesboro Community MLK events in time for the next meeting.

Messaging to Campus Community

• Election messaging was well-received across campus, including the Parent Facebook page. Danny Kelley recommended continuing with messaging, especially during the more challenging months of the semester. The committee discussed the timing of messaging and the importance of using direct language instead of euphemisms. Mary Kaye Anderson recommended that the committee work on end-of-year messaging as soon as possible to get it out before the close of the semester. Amy, Lance, and Lauren spoke about the specifics of what should go into messaging. It was explained that it would be important for others to know what the CNVC does, we should mirror as much previous language as possible for consistency in tone and resources, as well as strategically time when the messaging is pushed. Amy Korstange agreed to work on messaging to share with campus, to help get messaging out before the Thanksgiving break and end of semester. Maigan agreed to complete a graphic to go with messaging.

 engagement and getting buy-in from both academic and student affairs.
- It was recommended that committee members think about potential mental health speakers.
