HIGHLIGHTS

SUMMER PAY CAP ELIMINATION PROPOSAL

The Academic Affairs committee drafted and the Senate has approved (42 yeas / 0 nays / 1 abstention) a proposal that would revise clause A2 and section B of Policy 221 in order to remove the pay cap on faculty summer salary. The proposal also removes winter term from summer term calculations.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES RECEPTION

We are pleased to announce that the Board of Trustee Reception will be held on March 17th. Following the success of last year's event, this year's reception will highlight outstanding projects across a wide range of fields of study, offering our trustees an inspiring look at the innovation, creativity, and academic excellence driving our community forward.
