## **Student Health Services**

## **Examples of Fees**

MTSU Student Health Services realizes the impact of the cost of medical care on students' budgets, and we work to provide comprehensive primary care and women's health services at minimal cost to students. There is no fee for consultations with our staff for any illnesses, as this is a covered service under student fees. Health Services charges nominal fees for labs, x-rays, and physicals priced significantly below private sector prices (i.e., strep test \$7, x-ray \$20, physical \$12) and also offers reduced cost allergy desensitization, dietetic consults, and pharmacy services on site.

We hope the examples below will give you a feel for typical visit charges.

 You are feeling anxious, sad and unable to bear the pressure any more. You are here to see a clinician to be evaluated for depression. After evaluation, the clinician decides you would benefit from seeing a counselor at the MTSU counseling center, so you decide to go ahead and make that appointment.

record. The physician prescribes an appropriate antibiotic and you fill the prescription at the
MTSU pharmacy for a generic copay.

You accidentally twisted your ankle as you stepped off the curb while hurrying to class. You
hobble into the clinic and go to health services. The physician assesses your ankle and orders
an X ray. Your ankle is not broken, but is sprained. Your provider discusses splinting and
possible crutches. With a splint you are able to walk well even without crutches. Your provider
also gives you home exercises and asks you to follow-up in one week

• It has been quite a few years since your asthma has been problematic but this spring you have had difficulty with shortness of breath and wheezing during peak pollen times. The provider checks your pulmonary function tests and discusses the finding of "mild obstruction" they show. He discusses adding a preventive inhaler for relief of your symptoms. In 8<sup>th</sup> grade you remember being on Qvar for similar symptoms and mention its effectiveness then. You and your provider decide that is still an excellent option and fill your prescription at the MTSU pharmacy next door to the clinic using your prescription insurance.
