Send in your immunization records

MTSU requires full-time students to provide proof of two (2) doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) vaccine and two (2) doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine or proof of immunity or documentation of disease history from a health care provider. Submit proof of U.S. citizenship

The state of Tennessee requires proof of citizenship or lawful presence in the U.S. Complete and submit the annual FAFSA or visit mtsu.edu/evea for more information.
