

SGA Resolution 21-03-F

A Resolution to provide the students of Middle Tennessee State University with a “dead” period no more and no less than two class sessions before final examination in both the spring and fall semesters.

Whereas: Many students are overwhelmed before finals due to the burden of other tests, projects, papers, and quizzes

Whereas: This added stress of numerous assignments and tests directly before finals results in many students performing poorly on their final exams

Whereas: This “dead” period shall not affect once a week classes, but all other classes shall be expected to follow format

Whereas: No test, paper, project, case, or quiz that constitutes more than 10% of one’s grade may be given during the “dead” period

Whereas: This “dead” period shall go into effect the last two class periods of each class before finals, but students will still be expected to attend class


Whereas: Any student choosing to take final examinations prior to the start of the “dead” period will lose any privileges associated with the “dead” period


Whereas: Student organizations shall not hold mandatory activities.
