The MTSU McNair Program is a postbaccalaureate achievement program. The program is designed to increase the number of financially disadvantaged, first-generation, or underrepresented college students who pursue and complete the doctoral degree; to prepare promising students for graduate studies leading to the obtainment of a doctoral degree; and to help increase the diversity of college and university facilities. The program is named in honor of Ronald E. McNair, Challenger astronaut, 1978–1986.

The Ronald E. McNair postbaccalaureate program is a Federal TRIO program that is funded by the U.S. Department of Education.
