ET - 4815 - Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning Effective Fall 2019	Remove the 3 hour lab portion of this course, add 1 lecture hour and change it to a 3 credit hour lecture-only format.	The visiting Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission members have told us that many schools with an Engineering Technology program are teaching ET 4815 as a lecture course.	6
Discussion: Motion made to adopt both Engineering Technology proposals at the same time. Motion seconded.

ET - 4830 - Vibration Effective Fall 2019	Remove the 3 hour lab portion of this course, add 1 lecture hour and change it to a 3 credit hour lecture-only format.	The visiting Engineering Technology Accreditation Commission members have told us that many schools with an Engineering Technology program are teaching ET 4830 as a lecture course.	7

HLTH - 3260 - Environmental Health Effective Fall 2018	New course	The course will cover influences of the physical and social environment on health including definitions of toxicology, risk assessment and management, occupational health, and the role of social justice and environmental regulations on health. No prerequisites are required.	8
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Discussion: A program change proposal will need to be submitted to the committee when this course is requested to be added to the Community and Public Health program.

HLTH - 3350 - Survey of Human Disease Effective Fall 2018	New course	Introduction to the foundations of organ systems and disease. The course will include information on symptoms, diagnosis and the impact of both infectious and noninfectious disease on organ systems. Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in BIOL 2030/2031.	9
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Discussion: A program change proposal will need to be submitted to the committee when this course is requested to be added to the Community and Public Health program.

HLTH - 4020 - Biostatistics for Public Health Effective Fall 2018	New course	Introduction to the foundations of biostatistics for Public Health. Specific topics will include epidemiological study designs, hypothesis testing procedures, data visualization and statistical analyses. Emphasis will be placed on proper data collection, usage and analyses for Public Health. Prerequisite: A grade of C or better in MATH 1710. This course may be added to the degree requirements at a later time	10
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Discussion: A program change proposal will need to be submitted to the committee when this course is requested to be added to the Community and Public Health program.

Committee Actions: Approved unanimously.

ART - 4001 - Studio Workshop Effective Summer 2018	New Course	Subject matter to be determined by the instructor. The workshop may be conducted in the areas of Studio Art or Graphic Design. (A maximum of 9 credits may be applied toward a degree.) 3.000 Credit hours Prerequisites: Art 1620, 1630, 1630 with C or better or with permission of instructor.	3
