Introduces students to concrete testing, admixtures, placing, and finishing as well as the evaluation of concrete-making materials and their effects on properties of fresh and hardened concrete materials.	1

Examines effects of concrete-making materials (aggregates, cements, admixtures, etc.) on the properties of fresh and hardened concrete.	2
