Project Title: Researching Food Markets in Singapore and Malaysia to Better Understand Cultural Preferences in Terms of Food Availability, Prices, and Popularity

Over the 2023 Summer I will be helping Dr. Ida Leggett lay the groundwork for future field research in Southeast Asia. This exploratory research will be conducted over the course of 2 weeks, and is part of a larger focus on the cultural context of food and foodways (the process and conceptions around finding, making, and eating food) in non-Western societies, and examines how two bordering nations, Singapore and Malaysia, conceptualize food and health. The overall aim of her research is to better understand the relationship of food availability to the rising rates of Type 2 diabetes in both countries, which are some of the highest in the region of Southeast Asia (Singapore) and the world (Malaysia) ("Singapore Is No. 2 Nation With Most Diabetics: 5 Things About Diabetes"). In this first stage of research, I will be going to Singapore with Dr. Leggett from May 22 to June 4. While there I will help Dr. Leggett explore the contents, layouts, and purchasing patterns of two different kinds of food markets: the first is the traditional wet market, usually outdoors and selling fruits, vegetables, and meats on a daily basis. This is where most Singaporeans of all ethnicities (the three main ethnic groups in Singapore are the Chinese, Malays, and Indians) do their daily food shopping. The second kind of food market I will explore is the Western supermarket, of which there are several including Cold Storage, and Fair Price. While walking through both types of markets, I will survey what goods are being sold, what is popular, at what prices, and also the perceived demographics of the shoppers. The data gathered will help

ascertain the bigger picture of how food availability defines healthy and nonhealthy options locally.

During the second week of research Dr. Leggett will go to Kuala Lumpur and conduct research in the same venues. While Dr. Leggett is in Malaysia I will stay in Singapore and be in charge of a secondary survey of the wet markets and supermarkets, narrowing down the inventory of fruits, vegetables, and meats regularly available and purchased. I will be learning ethnographic field skills through my observations and notetaking in the markets, and also be in charge of photographing (with permission) the stalls and shelves. I will not be conducting any interviews on this trip, so IRB permission is not required. At the end of the research project, upon returning to Murfreesboro on June 5, Dr. Leggett and I will co-author an article on "Foodways in Southeast Asia" and submit it to the *Journal for Undergraduate Ethnography* for possible publication. As part of this research project, I will also create a presentation on my field research for a presentation at the Study Abroad Fair in Fall 2023.
