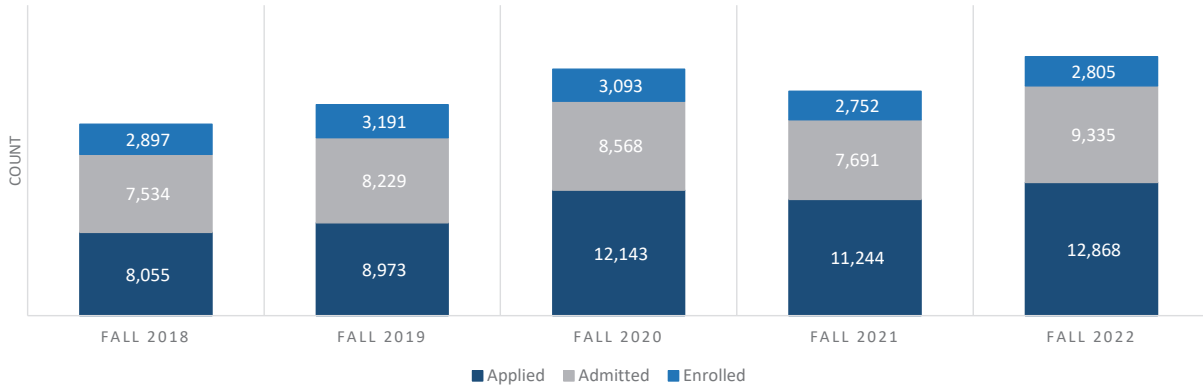

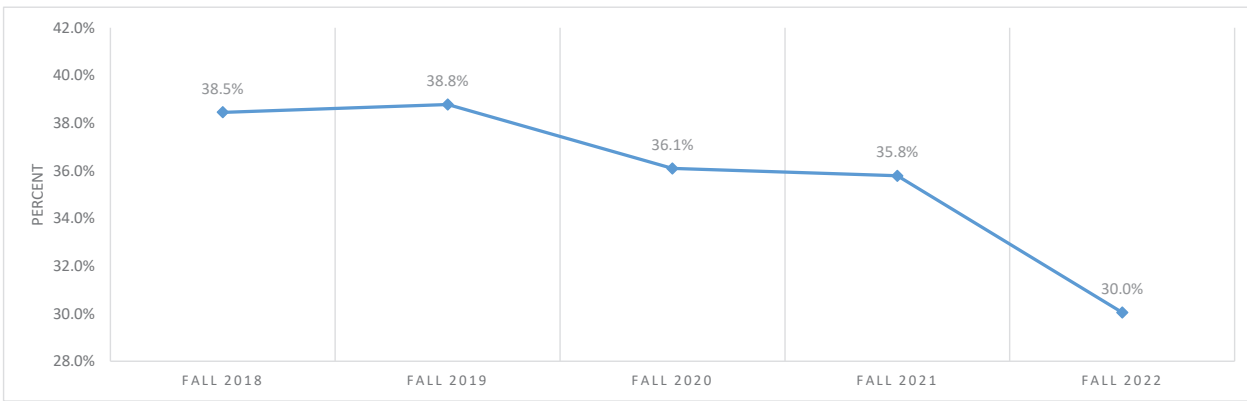

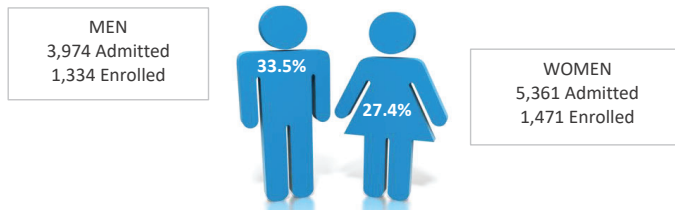
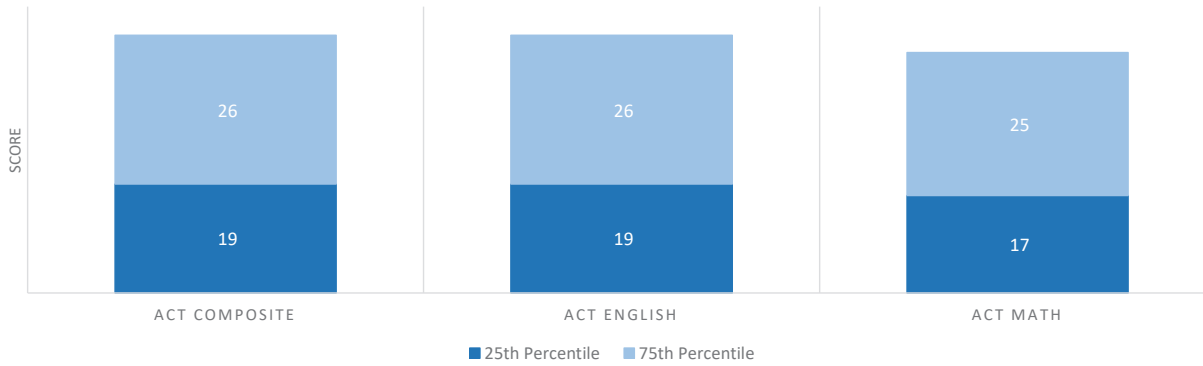
## New Freshmen Applied, Admitted and Enrolled

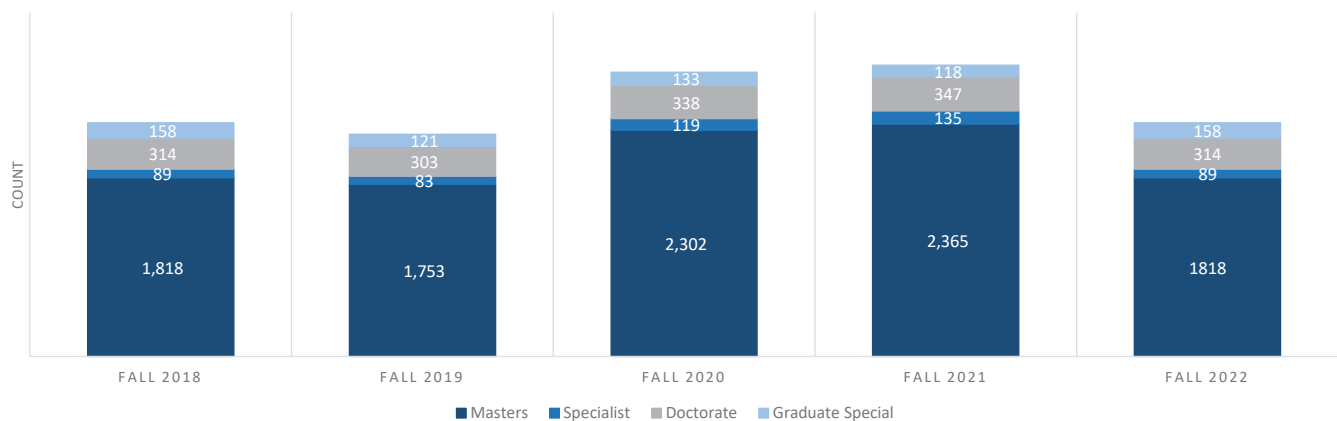

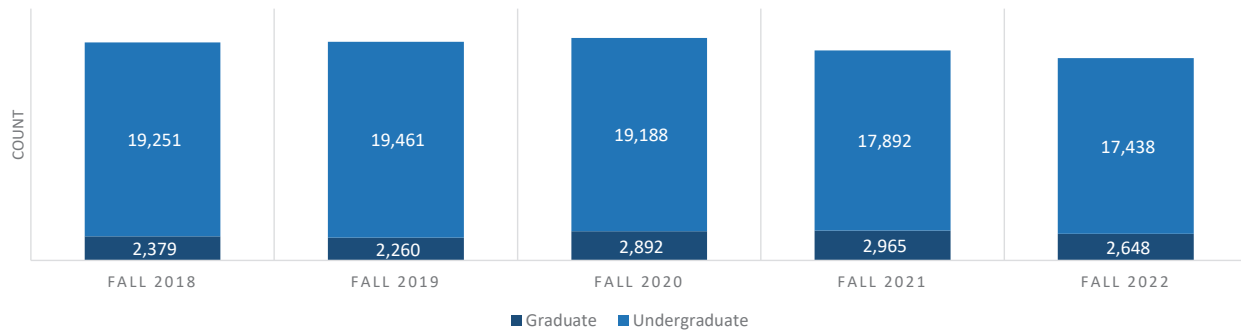

### Graduate Headcount by Classification

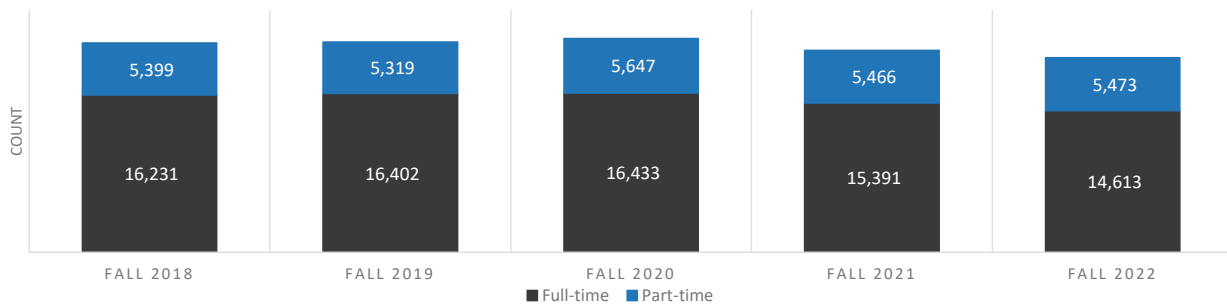

### Total Fall Headcount by Enrollment Status



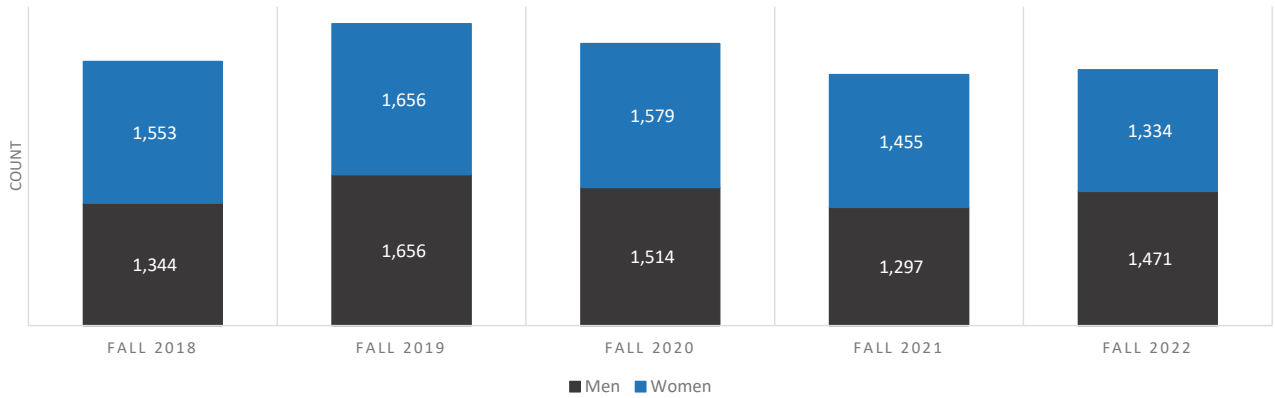

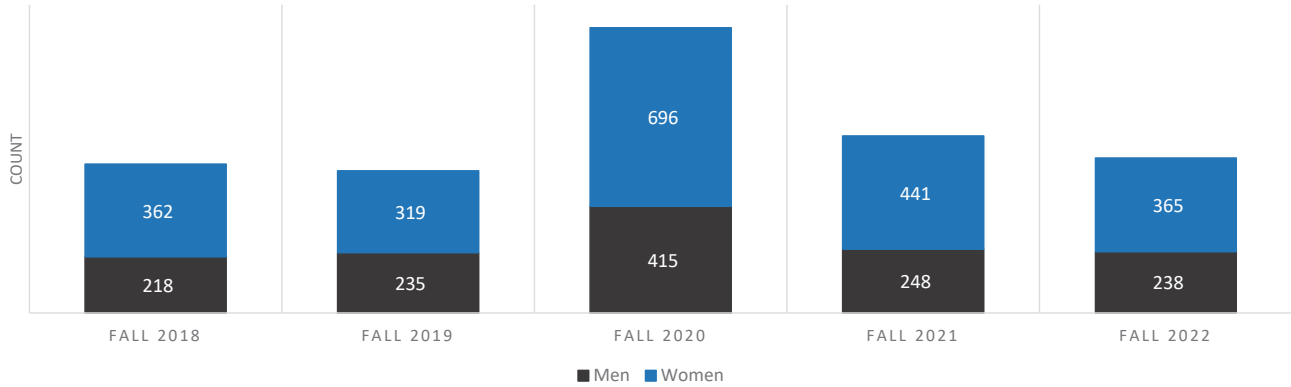

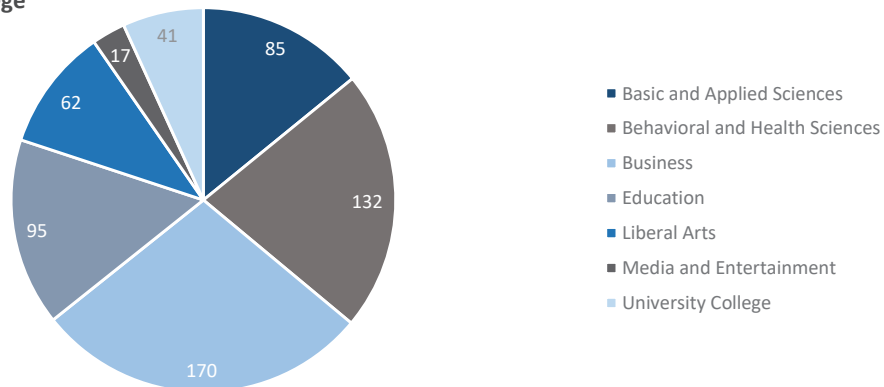

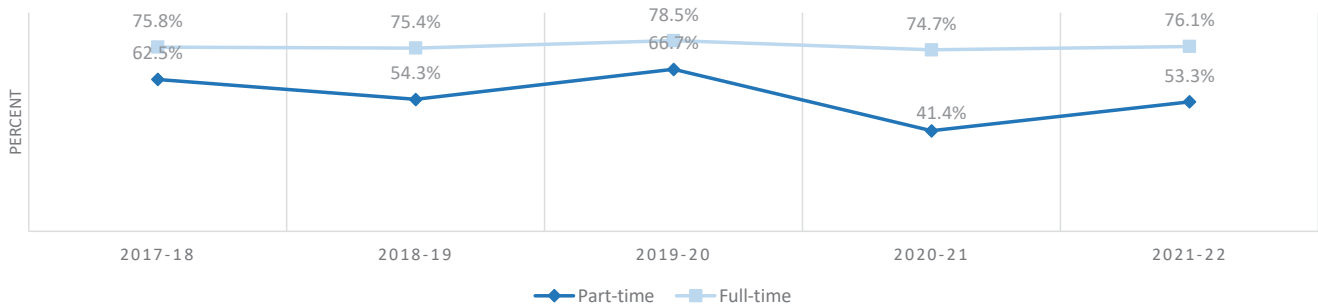

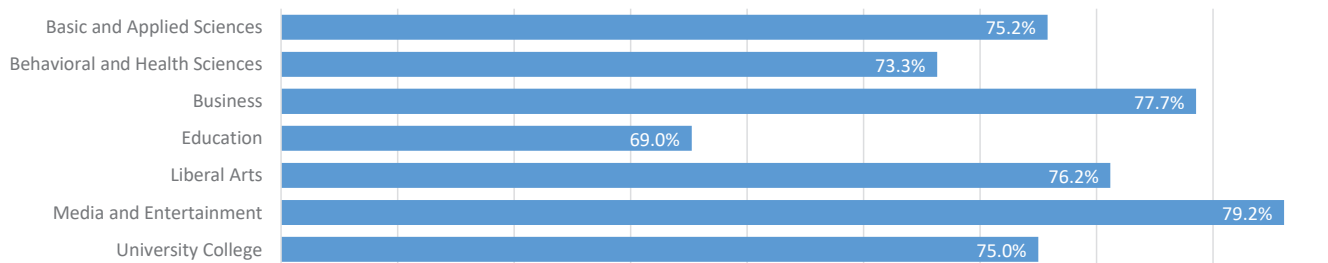

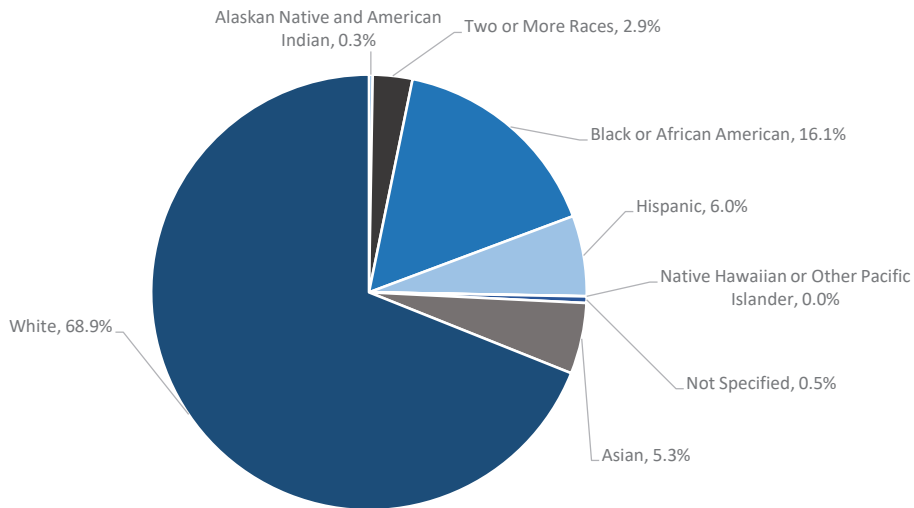

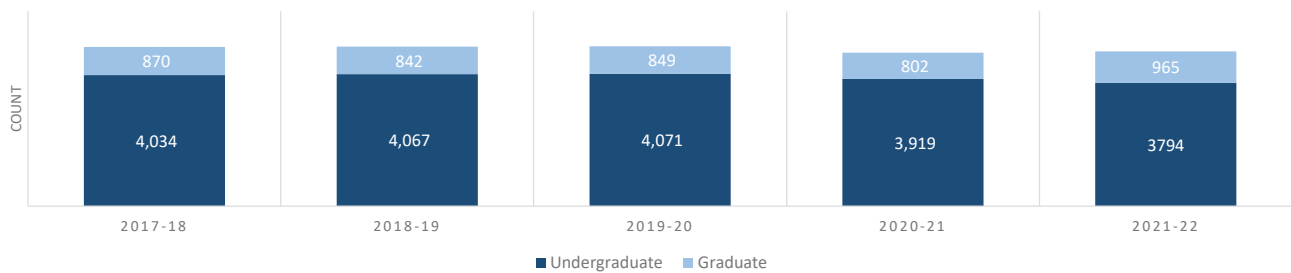

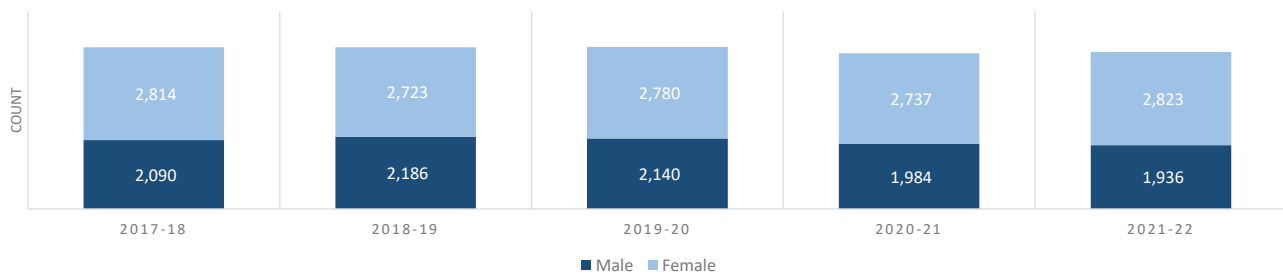

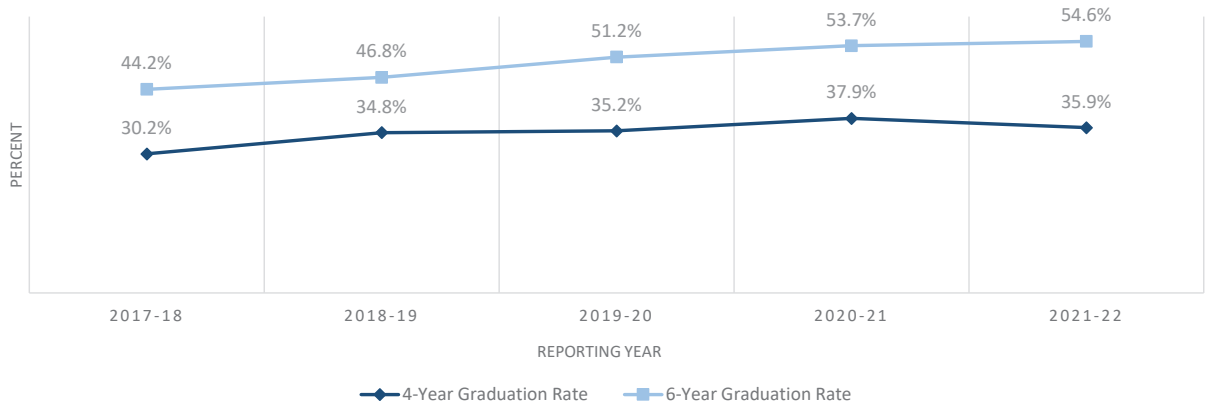

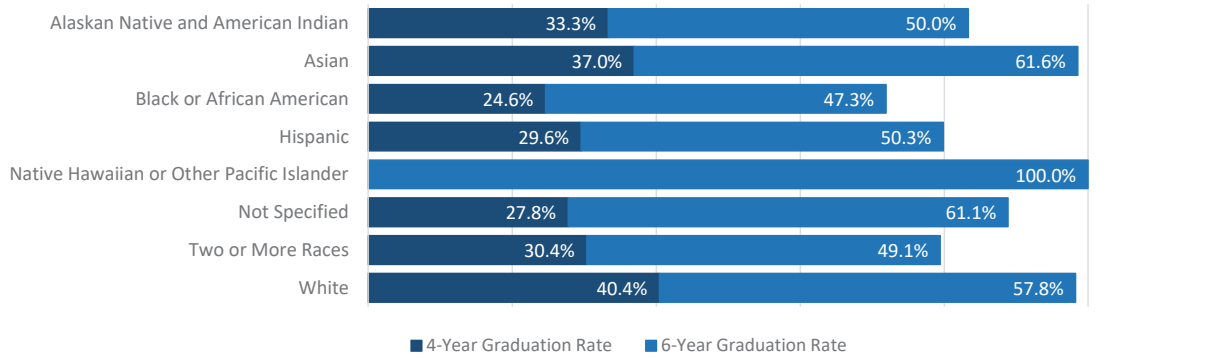

## Institutional Graduation Rates by Ethnicity

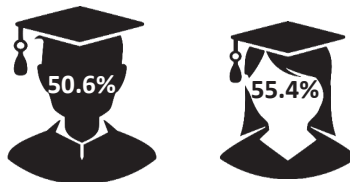

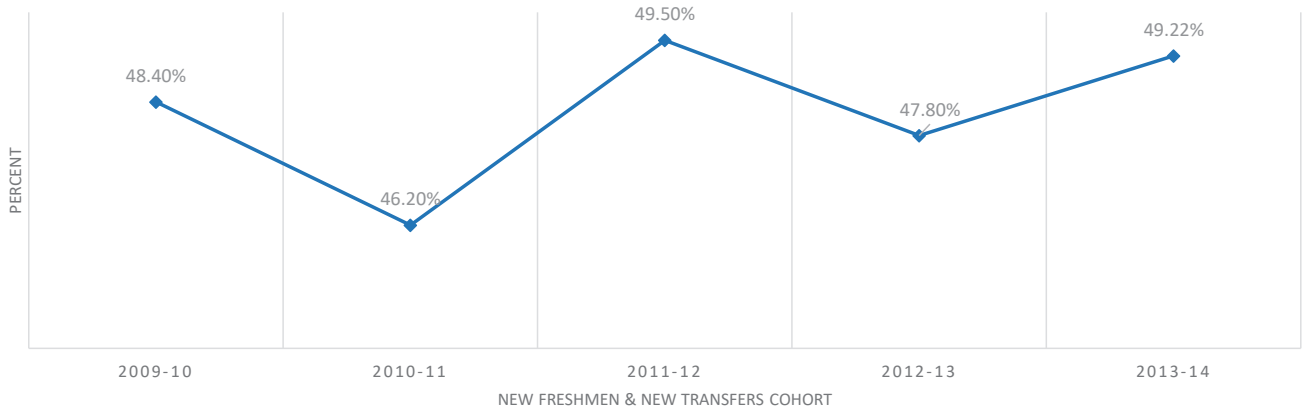
